SESSION 1: TREE COMMISSION ACADEMY -

THE SHORT COURSE

The regional urban forester (Siewert for Cleveland and Lorain, Miller for Toledo) will give a short introduction to Tree Commission Academy, the content of the full courses, and the value to communities.
