



Partners for Clean Streams (PCS) along with community partners, hosted the 21st Annual Clean Your Streams Day on Saturday, September 23rd, 2017. This year, **910** volunteers from across Northwest Ohio convened in the heat to clean the rivers. They removed a total of **23,789** pounds of trash and debris from the riverbanks in the greater metropolitan Toledo area. The day began with an orientation and check in at 8 different kick-off locations. Then, each group spread out to one of the 69 cleanup sites assigned to them. At the site, volunteers removed litter from the rivers and land and recorded their findings onto data cards. After the cleanup, volunteers had the opportunity to attend the Appreciation Picnic to celebrate their efforts toward improving local waterways. To show our gratitude, volunteers received a CYS 21 t-shirt, Marco's pizza for lunch, educational activities, a paid raffle, and a door prize raffle. Fred LeFebvre from 1370 WSPD MC-ed the event and announced the Challenge Awards winners.

Clean Your Streams (CYS) is the largest single-day cleanup in northwest Ohio, as well as the largest cleanup in Ohio for the International Coastal Cleanup (ICC). The impact can be measured within 9 local watersheds, including the Ottawa River, Swan Creek, Maumee River, and Maumee Bay tributaries. The data cards filled out by volunteers will be totaled and submitted for this year's ICC database. As part of the 2016 International Coastal Cleanup, over 500,000 volunteers removed more than 18 million pounds of trash from waterways around the world. CYS contributes to those numbers each year, visibly demonstrating this regions' impact on the global issue of marine debris.

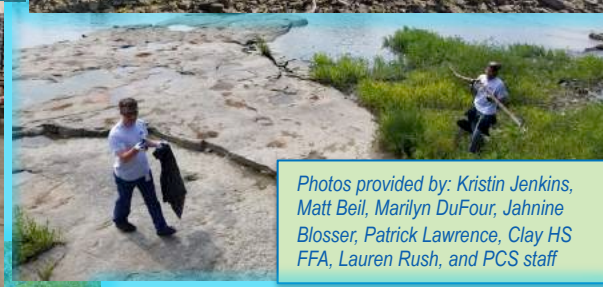
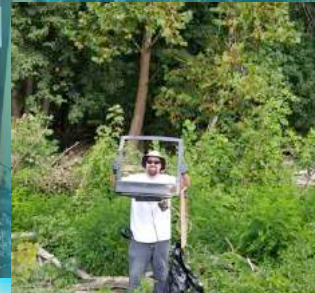
