The *Give Water a Hand* business campaign is the first water quality education program in our region to focus entirely on helping businesses save money, time and resources while protecting our area's rivers and streams. This voluntary program will provide business owners and managers information and assistance to help them save money and prevent pollution.

The following business sectors have been identified for participation in the program: restaurants; vehicle service (gas stations, service stations/body shops, junk/salvage yards, towing services, outdoor storage); general businesses (industrial, dry cleaners, office complexes); home repair & maintenance (painters, plumbers, carpet cleaners, HVAC, general contractors, fire & water damage, septic & drain cleaners).

In return for participation in pollution prevention efforts, free publicity will be provided for businesses through a variety of news articles, window stickers and advertising. Here are some benefits to your business for participating:

- Save money! Reduce operating expenses by improved housekeeping;
- Save time! Less time will be needed to fix a problem if it is managed properly;
- FREE promotions from a window static sticker, web sites, news articles and paid advertisements provided by the program;
- FREE technical assistance to identify opportunities for preventing pollution;
- Possible storm water tax credit depending on your community;
- Potential customers will be informed of which businesses are *Give Water a Hand* partners;
- Personal satisfaction that your business is doing something to help protect the environment.

The *Give Water a Hand: You Can Make a Difference* campaign is a cooperative educational effort focused on educating residents and business owners of Northwest Ohio about storm water and other water quality issues. The average citizen and business owner does impact water quality and can make a positive difference. The Maumee RAP (Remedial Action Plan) and Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments (TMACOG) are partnering with local cities, villages, and townships to educate the region about improving water quality and managing water quantity. The following jurisdictions are participating in the program: Lucas County, Cities of Toledo, Northwood and Oregon; Villages of Haskins, Holland, Millbury, Waterville; Townships of Monclova, Springfield, Sylvania and Washington.
