 It's a direct connection to your local river, stream or lake.
- Storm drains transport all runoff from rainfall, snowmelt or sprinklers directly to our local waterways. Unlike wastewater from your home, storm water is not treated.
- When water washes into the drains, pollutants are carried along for the ride. Litter, pet waste, dirt, fertilizers, antifreeze and motor oil are just a few examples of contaminants that enter our waterways through storm drains.
- Misused, clogged or polluted storm drains or ditches can increase flooding, damage your property and harm our waterways. No filters, no treatment. Swimming, anyone...?
